### STUDY WHERE CLIMATE CHANGE IS REAL

Spend your summer in the land of the midnight sun. In this intensive six-week course—for science and non-science students—discover how climate change is altering one of the world's great wildernesses and then conduct research that will help map a sustainable future for the Arctic.

### GLACIERS, REINDEER, AND SAMI CULTURE

The course begins at KTH Institute in Stockholm, where your classes introduce the political, social, and cultural issues of climate change. The sessions prepare you and your Swedish classmates for the research you'll then conduct in the Arctic. Melting glaciers and thinning sea ice the possibility of new shipping routes and resource extraction that will drastically alter the fragile ecosystem and its native reindeer-herding Sami culture.

### PROGRAM FEE\*

\$3,000-3,500. Includes: Study Abroad fees, U of I summer tuition, airfare to Sweden and the Arctic, all lodging, museum entrance fees in Stockholm, and transportation related to class activities.
